Amidst Pain, Willpower is Born

Amid a heavy devastating war, with flames consuming lives and echoing the cries of an orphaned child, a woman uprooted from her home, and a man stripped of dignity, the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles – Towards Building a New Country – convened for their second meeting.

They upheld the banner of the revolution that the Sudanese people continue to champion, culminating in the glorious December Revolution, which has only gained strength with each attempt by its adversaries to extinguish it.

Three years have passed since the tragic war ignited on April 15 by the National Congress regime and its Islamist movement, perpetuated by two warring factions vying for control of Sudan's resources. These factions conspired to undermine the December Revolution and eradicate the people's aspirations for freedom, peace, and justice.

This war has resulted in the world's largest displacement crisis, further fracturing the national fabric and employing hate speech, racism, and tribal and regional prejudices as insidious weapons to divide what remains of the nation. It has claimed the lives of tens of thousands of innocent individuals, displaced millions of Sudanese—both internally and as refugees in neighboring countries—and led to the collapse of health, education, and livelihood systems, as well as basic services. The menace of famine looms daily over millions of vulnerable families, creating a humanitarian crisis unprecedented in our country's history.

However, Sudan—its people, its land, and its will—transcends all conspiracies and demonstrates resilience greater than all adversity.

Strategic Documents: Towards Building a New Country

The second meeting of the Sudanese Forces of the Declaration of Principles concluded with outputs appropriate to the gravity of the situation in Sudan. The meeting adopted several documents that form integrated strategies for ceasing and ending the war, achieving a civilian democratic transition, and building a Sudan characterized by freedom, peace, and justice. The meeting approved:

- The Charter of the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles, which represents an evolution and deepening of the Declaration of Principles issued at the first meeting in Nairobi on December 16, 2025.
- The Roadmap for Stopping and Ending the War – Towards a New Path for Sustainable Solutions and the Restoration of the Revolutionary Spirit, which integrates, through simultaneous and interconnected practical tracks, the issues of humanitarian operations, temporary and permanent ceasefires, and the political process.

The Political Process: Conditions of Credibility and National Ownership

The meeting emphasized that the political process advocated by the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles is not merely another settlement between warring parties, but a profound initiative that addresses the root causes of the Sudanese wars. It seeks to achieve a definitive break from the cycle of fragile solutions and false reconciliations that precipitated the disastrous April 15 wars.

This process is anchored in several non-negotiable pillars. Foremost among these is that the political process must be crafted with a purely Sudanese will, ensuring broad participation from anti-war civil forces. Its success requires a comprehensive approach that enhances the prospects for sustainable solutions and safeguards against sabotage. The process must be founded on clear procedures and steps to create a conducive environment, a declaration of principles, frameworks for participation, and an explicit definition of the involved parties and mechanisms.

Participants stressed that the political process should not reward those responsible for igniting this war—most notably the National Congress Party, its Islamist movement, and their affiliates—but rather hold them accountable for the devastation they have caused. Impunity will only lead to further conflict.

The political process must culminate in binding and clear outcomes for all parties, including a comprehensive final peace agreement, a transitional constitution, and a unified national security and military system into which all militias and armies are integrated.

The meeting underscored the importance of organized consultation with international and regional mediation mechanisms at every stage of the political process design, advocating for the unification of external platforms into a single framework based on the Quad Roadmap issued in September 2025, the Sudanese Declaration of Principles, and Berlin's document. This approach rejects the dispersion of multiple platforms that have weakened peace efforts and prolonged the suffering of both citizens and the nation.

The Unity of Sudan: An Inviolable Principle

In light of the most significant threat to Sudan's future—the risk of division, fragmentation, and disintegration due to societal subjugation and state collapse—the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles convened and unequivocally asserted: the unity of Sudan, its people, its land, and its full

sovereignty over its territory, resources, airspace, and territorial waters is a steadfast principle that cannot be compromised, debated, or manipulated.

The forces of the Declaration of Principles distanced themselves from the rhetoric of hatred, racism, and tribal and regional incitement that seeks to undermine Sudanese identity and foster discord among the nation's citizens. They expressed their resolute rejection of such discourse and their commitment to full resistance through all available means.

Sudan is a nation whose diversity serves as a source of strength; its ethnic, cultural, linguistic, and religious variety is a legacy of pride for generations to come. Those who exploit hatred for political or military advantage commit a grave offense against the nation and its people and will be held accountable before the Sudanese populace and the courts of justice.

The secession of South Sudan remains a profound lesson and loss for us. We assert to all: Sudan will not become a project of division, regardless of the instigators. It is a homeland that embraces all and values diversity without succumbing to it, and it tolerates differences without allowing them to create divides. This is the principle that the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles are dedicated to defending with unwavering resolve.

The Civil Front: An Obligation to Act

In times of war that ravage your homeland, infringe upon your dignity, and indiscriminately engulf all in their path, coordinated and unified action becomes an urgent necessity—a national duty that transcends minor disputes and narrow interests. Consequently, the meeting of the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles determined that strengthening and consolidating collaboration among its members is imperative for all political and civil organizations and societal segments that oppose this war and are suffering its repercussions.

Moving forward necessitates the establishment of a third bloc: a broad civil front against war. This front will unite all forces advocating for revolution, peace, and democracy into a singular, cohesive entity, pursuing the warring parties and their allies through popular, political, media, and diplomatic channels while employing all proven methods of peaceful civil action. The voice of the masses rejecting war is the true catalyst for building the Sudanese peace movement. The participants reaffirmed their unwavering commitment to finalizing this legitimate framework.

In this context, the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles emphasized that they are not a closed entity monopolizing opinions and decisions but rather an open platform for all civil and democratic forces that share their rejection of war, commitment to the principles of a democratic civilian transition, and adherence to the spirit and goals of the revolution.

Within this framework, the meeting reviewed the report from the committee responsible for processing applications to join the Sudanese Declaration of Principles. It tasked its preparatory committee with reaching out to the organizations and entities that submitted applications, in preparation for reviewing them according to the established procedures and criteria. The front we are building will expand with the participation of all who believe in a new, unified Sudan for all.

To the Resilient Sudanese: You are the heart and soul of the revolution

To every Sudanese individual bearing the burden of this war—in overcrowded refugee camps, besieged urban neighborhoods, tranquil villages, and distant exiles—the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles express their complete and unwavering solidarity with every victim of this unjust war, every family torn apart, every child deprived of their childhood, every woman whose dignity has been violated, and every man humiliated.

Your extraordinary resilience throughout these challenging years is irrefutable evidence that the will of the Sudanese people surpasses all wars. You who have maintained your humanity through mutual support and sharing the minimum; you who have organized community committees and initiatives, illuminating hope amidst destruction, you embody the enduring spirit of the revolution and the foundation of the new nation we are building together.

We extend a heartfelt invitation to all democratic civil forces and organizations, as well as to the suffering and discontented Sudanese people who reject this cursed war, to join a unified path developed by the Forces of the Sudanese Declaration of Principles. This path will align our wills and efforts to cease this war and forge our journey toward the new homeland our people deserve.

We call upon all regional and international powers, humanitarian organizations, and peace-loving entities globally to stand in solidarity with the afflicted people of Sudan and to commit all diplomatic and humanitarian resources to halt this ongoing violence. History will not forgive those who remain passive in the face of war crimes.

The path ahead may be long, but clear. Our will is alive and unwavering. The Sudan we envision—a new homeland, a Sudan characterized by freedom, peace, and justice, as enshrined by the victorious December Revolution.
